


Dr Cheung Huen Cheong Thomas 張煊昌博士

1929-2023



In Loving Memory of Dr Cheung Huen Cheong Thomas MH FCII

Dr Cheung was a prominent figure and a distinguished personage in the Hong Kong insurance industry, a well-known entrepreneur, a renowned philanthropist, loving and committed husband, father, grandfather and great grandfather.

Dr Cheung founded The Pacific Insurance Company, Limited and The Pacific Life Assurance Company, Limited in 1960. He had over 70 years of experience in insurance industry. In 2019, the Chartered Insurance Institute (CII) awarded the Honorary Fellowship to Dr Cheung for his contribution and seven decades of service to the insurance profession. He was the first international insurance professional outside of the United Kingdom to receive this honour.

His business venture took him to Sri Lanka, and with his long association, he was appointed and served as Honorary Consul for Sri Lanka in Hong Kong and Macau SAR for nearly 30 years. In recognition of his great contribution to the country, the President of Sri Lanka conferred upon him the National Honour Sri Lanka Ranjana in 1991 and also named a village after him as Thomas Cheung Gama.

A renowned philanthropist, Dr Cheung made numerous contributions to charities for education, medicine, disaster relief, and poverty alleviation in Hong Kong and overseas. He is especially supportive to The Chinese University of Hong Kong, making numerous donations to set up scholarships, build sporting facilities, support staff and student activities and for medical research.

Dr Cheung was a passionate advocate for education and served as Emeritus Chairman or Director of a number of educational institutions. His major donations to The Education Foundation of The Federation of The Alumni Associations of The Chinese University of Hong Kong helped to establish CUHK FAA Thomas Cheung Secondary School, CUHK FAA Thomas Cheung School and CUHK FAA Thomas Cheung Kindergarten.

Dr Cheung received a degree of Doctor of Laws *honoris causa*, CUHK (1993), Medal of Honour, the Government of the HKSAR (2005) and a Honorary Fellow CUHK (2005), Honorary University Fellow, The Open University of Hong Kong (2005) and many other recognitions.

As his birthplace, Dr Cheung always had a deep affection towards Hong Kong and a strong desire to give back. His path of success and numerous contributions to Hong Kong is an exemplary model for future generations.

Dr Cheung ascribed his working principles as meticulous planning, courageous implementation, far-sighted vision and rigorous review. These were his mighty steps towards his success and accounts for his outstanding achievements.

He leaves a strong legacy in the companies that he founded, with his family, children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren.



永遠懷念 張煊昌博士MH, FCII

1929-2023

張博士是香港保險業界的領袖人物,也是成功的企業家及熱心公益的慈 善家,同時亦是一位慈愛盡責的丈夫、父親、祖父及曾祖父。

張博士屹立保險業已逾七十載,對香港保險發展貢獻良多。1960年,他 成立太平洋保險有限公司及太平洋人壽保險有限公司。2019年,英國特 許保險學院更向張博士授予榮譽資深院士頭銜,以表彰他七十年來對保 險業的貢獻及服務,成為英國以外首位榮獲此殊榮的國際保險從業員。

張博士因公務需要頻繁踏足斯里蘭卡,與當地建立長久及良好合作關係, 被該國委任為斯里蘭卡駐香港及澳門名譽領事接近30年。他更於1991年 獲斯里蘭卡總統頒授國家榮譽勛銜 Sri Lanka Ranjana,總統更將當地一 條鄉村以張博士的姓名命名為 Thomas Cheung Gama,以表揚他對斯里 蘭卡作出的卓越貢獻。


張博士同時是一位樂善好施的慈善家,他心繁社會,對海內外教育、醫療、賑災、扶貧等領域的慈善事業均慷慨解囊。張博士鼎力支持母校香 港中文大學的發展,包括設立獎學金、建設體育設施、支援教職員及學 生活動,並捐助款項支援中大的醫學研究。

熱心參與教育,張博士亦曾任多間教育機構的榮譽主席或董事,更向中 大校友會聯會屬下教育基金會捐助鉅款,成立香港中文大學校友會聯會 張煊昌中學、香港中文大學校友會聯會張煊昌學校及香港中文大學校友 會聯會張煊昌幼稚園。

張博士榮獲多項名銜及殊榮,包括1993年獲香港中文大學授予榮譽法學 博士名銜、2005年獲香港特區政府頒發榮譽勛章、香港中文大學授予榮 譽院士名銜、香港公開大學授予榮譽大學院士名銜。

張博士生於香港,因此對這片土地懷揣濃厚感情,希望回饋我城。他的 成功之道以及對香港的無盡貢獻,堪稱後人楷模。他曾表示,做人處事 應當縝密規劃、大膽執行、高瞻遠矚、嚴密審視,而他亦嚴遵這些原則, 穩步邁向成功之路,取得傑出成就。

相信張博士的成就與貢獻,將深烙其創辦的公司之員工、其家人、子女、 孫輩及曾孫輩的心中。



















Most people who knew my father, including his business associates, employees, colleagues, and friends, would have known him as someone with immense business acumen. He had foresight, determination, and courage that helped him weather many corporate storms during the growth and establishment of his company. He was never afraid of challenges, or the seemingly impossible. It was never too much trouble, too time consuming, or too costly to chase after his opportunities. He pursued his business dreams with utmost passion, ingenuity, and tenacity. Pacific Insurance Corporation is the ultimate testimony to my father's character, decades of hard work, and vision. It is my father's legacy.

As we know, he also contributed to many communities. He donated generously to the areas of education, economic relief, and the arts. He had great compassion for the young, vulnerable, and those in need. He was quick to offer a helping hand, and never quibbled over the trouble or cost of doing so. He never held a grudge, was quick to let go of the trivial, and always forgave and forgot.

Most people probably don't know that my father was a professional musician. In his youth, in a time of war and economic scarcity, he worked in nightclubs playing the violin and saxophone. With no musical training or the ability to read music, his knowledge of popular music of the day was extensive, and he could play and improvise



with a band spontaneously. I remember many years ago, we were in a restaurant that had live music. I had no idea of the depth of my father's music repertoire, until he started requesting song after song from the 50's and the 60's. The whole dinner evening was rapturously immersed in the music of Elvis Presley, Paul Anka, Dean Martin, Frank Sinatra, and many more.

My father inherited his musical talent from his father, who also was a musician, and toured extensively with a band playing the erhu. My father passed on his musical genes to many of his children; but for me, I took after him in his love of animals and horses. He rode retired race horses when he was young. It was no small feat to ride these horses. because they were just off-the-track thoroughbred horses that had no training, no handling, and were very young. Knowing what I know now about horses, it was an extremely dangerous activity, and could have turned fatal for humans and horses in the blink of an eve. In fact, one time, he actually did fall off a horse, and had to have seven stitches administered above his eyebrow. It was after this accident that he decided to give up riding, because he realized it could jeopardize his work life. But my father was always supportive of his children. Despite the inherent danger of horseback riding, he understood my love for horses, and encouraged me to pursue my interest. I have owned several horses, and continue to enjoy arena and outdoor riding.



In my day-to-day surroundings, there are many things that remind me of my father, so memories of him will always be close to me. But perhaps I feel his presence the most when I am on a horse, doing something that he also enjoyed, knowing that he and I shared the understanding and appreciation for horses. These heavenly creatures are full of vitality, intelligence, and love. My father also embodied these virtuous characteristics, and lived a life that was filled with zestful spirit of the noble equus.
